## PASTOR'S COLUMN

**CATHOLIC CHARITIES** – I am pleased to announce that Bob and Sandy Vigeant have accepted my invitation to be this year's **Catholic Charities Chairpersons** for our parish. We look forward to having a successful appeal.

**CREMATION AND FUNERALS** – recent events have prompted some questions about the Church's policy with regard to cremation and in light of that this parish's policy. Basically although cremation is now permitted, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. **Catholic teaching continues to stress the preference for burial or entombment of the body of the deceased.** If cremation is to take place, the church asks that it be done after the funeral with the body present and that the cremated remains must be buried. This parish is fully compliant with the Church's instructions with regard to cremation. One thing to note is that **if there is no intention to bury the cremated remains then a funeral mass cannot be scheduled.** I stress again the cremated remains must be buried and the place and date of the burial must usually be decided upon before the Funeral Mass. Burial is the only acceptable conclusion to Catholic funeral rites.


I urge you all to make your wishes clear with regard to your own funeral arrangements and unless there are extenuating circumstances the Church would prefer that you not be cremated. I have inserted in this bulletin a flyer with some information from the United States Bishops regarding **Catholic Burial Practices.**

### The Law of Fast

All adults (18 and older) are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their 60<sup>th</sup> year. On days of fast, those bound by the law are limited to a single full meatless meal. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs; however, together these two meals should not equal another full meal. There are two prescribed days of fast: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

### Law of Abstinence:

Those who are 14 years of age and older are obliged to observe the law of abstinence. On days of abstinence, those bound by the law abstain from meat. On all Fridays of Lent, abstinence is prescribed and Ash Wednesday.
